March 3—*The Proposal* (2009)

Today's movie honors the memory of a true comedy icon: **Betty White**.


Faced with deportation to her native Canada, high-powered book editor Margaret Tate says she's engaged to marry Andrew Paxton, her hapless assistant. Andrew agrees to the charade, but imposes a few conditions of his own, including flying to Alaska to meet his eccentric family. With a suspicious immigration official always lurking nearby, Margaret and Andrew must stick to their wedding plan despite numerous mishaps.

Romance/Comedy. PG-13 for sexual content, language, brief nudity. 1 hour 48 minutes.



March 10 – *Cry Macho* (2021)

Based on the book, "*Cry Macho*" stars Clint Eastwood as a one-time rodeo star and washed-up horse breeder who, in 1978, takes a job from an ex-boss to bring the man's young son home and away from his alcoholic mom. Crossing rural Mexico on their way back to Texas, the unlikely pair faces an unexpectedly challenging journey, during which the world-weary horseman may find his own sense of redemption through teaching the boy what it means to be a good man. Drama/Western. PG -13 for language and thematic elements. 1 hour 44 minutes.



March 17 – *Heart of Champions* (2021)

After finishing last in the national championship, a college rowing team descends into turmoil and constant infighting between team leaders. A tough Army veteran, Coach Murphy, arrives at the start of the new season to transform the status quo and unlock their true potential. Using his experience and unconventional methods to help them overcome petty rivalries and personal challenges, Coach Murphy must inspire these young men to learn what it takes to be a team before they can be champions.

Drama/Sport. PG-13 for suggestive material, partial nudity and brief strong language. 1 hour 59 minutes.



March 24 – *Jungle Cruise* (2021)

Based on Disneyland's theme park ride: Dr. Lily Houghton enlists the aid of wisecracking skipper Frank Wolff to take her down the Amazon in his ramshackle boat. Together, they search for an ancient tree that holds the power to heal -- a discovery that will change the future of medicine. Action/Adventure/Comedy. PG-13 for sequences of adventure violence. 2 hour 7 minutes.



March 31 – *The Sandlot* (1993) ****PM Showing ONLY****

Scotty Smalls moves to a new neighborhood with his mom and stepdad, and wants to learn to play baseball. Rodriguez, the neighborhood baseball guru, takes Smalls under his wing - soon he becomes part of the local baseball buddies. They fall into adventures involving baseball, treehouse sleep-ins, the desirous lifeguard at the local pool, the snooty rival ball team, and the travelling fair. Beyond the fence at the back of the sandlot menaces a legendary ball-eating dog called *The Beast*, and the kids inevitably must deal with him.
